Level 2 Spanish

Level 2 Spanish reviews material studied in Level 1 and takes it to a higher level with progressively more complex grammatical concepts and structures.

Themes:

- Your school day/routine
- Special events
- You and your community
- Memories from the past
- Current events in the news
- Television and movies
- More on food and cooking
- How to be a good tourist/citizen
- What will your future hold?

Skills:

By the end of level 2 Spanish, students will be able to:

- Ask for information and conduct interviews
- Talk about extracurricular activities
- Talk about daily routines, getting ready for events
- Talk about shopping, bargaining, prices, money
- Talk about running errands
- Talk about places in cities, towns, countries and in the country
- Know driving terms and modes of transportation
- Know expressions describing etiquette, family and holiday celebrations
- Talk about and describe their early childhood ie: toys, play terms, etc.
- Talk about the news/current events ie: natural disasters, emergencies, rescues, accidents, heroes, elections, war

- Talk about specific television programs and movies and sporting events describing action, genre, characters
- Make interpretations of meaning of some programs
- Movie Making terms
- Will be able to use cooking terms, name kitchen appliances, follow a recipe, give directions in a kitchen
- Give directions in finding a place
- Talk about camping and nature
- Talk about traveling, airports, safety, planning trips
- Talk about staying in a hotel, appropriate tourist behaviors
- Talk about traveling in a foreign country
- Discuss professions, making plans for the future and earning a living
- Talk about the environment and environmental issues

- Reciprocal actions
- Present perfect tense
- Verbs that use indirect objects
- The impersonal 'se'
- The future tense of regular and irregular verbs
- Introduction of the present subjunctive, regular, irregular and stem changing verbs

- Present subjunctive with impersonal expressions and expressions of doubt
